



We don't know which treatment is better

The data on treatments for Dupuytren's Contracture comes from different studies. This means we cannot say if Collagenase injections or Surgery are as good or as safe as each other




Stiffness, Nerve injury, Painful swelling (CRPS), after either treatmen Tendon rupture after injection but rare



Moderate complications are those which may cause lasting problems of numbness or reduced movement

Recurrence - finger bends back again slowly
