This online experiment involves volunteers, such as yourself, being randomly assigned to different ways of presenting feedback from national audits. Should you consent, you will pick a national audit most relevant to your work. You will then see a web page which includes hypothetical but realistic audit data. You will only see one version of feedback. We will then ask you some questions to assess your reactions to the feedback. We will collect and analyse responses to assess which ways of providing feedback data are likely to be more useful than others.

If you are not typically responsible for receiving and acting on data from audit reports, as an individual clinician or on behalf of your team or organisation, then please ignore and exit this study.
